Coronavirus Job Retention Scheme (CJRS) Statistics: July 2021¹

Key points

- In total, the latest provisional figures show that Midlands Engine area had 264,900 employments furloughed on the 30th June 2021. This was 6.2% of eligible employments for the scheme compared to UK-wide of 6.5%.
- When compared to 31st May 2021, the Midlands Engine area had 66,900 fewer employments furloughed (-20.2%, UK: -24.1%).
- As of the 30th June 2021 for the Midlands Engine, the take up rate for males was 6.6% (UK 6.8%) and female take-up rate was 5.8% (UK 6.1%).
- Accommodation and food services sector had the highest number of employments furloughed in the Midlands Engine on the 30th June with 43,450 people.
- The latest provisional figures shows that the West Midlands region had 159,400 employments furloughed and the East Midlands region had 118,200 employments furloughed as of 30th June 2021 the lowest numbers on record (data available for 1st July 2020).
- Compared to the 31st May 2021, the West Midlands region decreased by 19.2% (-37,800 employments furloughed), while the East Midlands decreased by 22.2% (-33,800 employments furloughed), and the UK decreased by 24.1% over the same period.
- The highest number of employments furloughed by age group for the West Midlands region and also the East Midlands region on the 30th June was those aged 50 to 54 at 18,700 and 14,000 employments furloughed respectively.
- For the UK, provisional figures show that the number of employments on furlough was 1.9 million on the 30th June 2021 lowest number since the start of the pandemic.
- For all age bands the number of employments on furlough and the take-up rates decreased between 31st May and 30th June. The largest proportionate reduction of number of employments on furlough was for the under 18 age band UK-wide.
- For the UK, for all employer sizes, the number of employments on furlough decreased across February, March, April, May and June 2021. The largest reduction is for employers with 250 or more employees where the number of employments on furlough decreased by 254,400 from 595,200 employments at 31st May 2021 to a provisional estimate of 340,700 at 30th June 2021.


Furloughed Employments Over Time - UK, West Midlands and East Midlands Regions

• For the UK, the number of employments on furlough peaked at 8.9 million on 8th May 2020. This fell to 2.4 million at 31st October, rose again to 4.9 million employments on furlough at 31st January 2021. However, the number of employments on furlough has fallen since January and provisional figures show that the number of employments on furlough was 1.9 million on the 30th June 2021 – lowest number since the start of the pandemic.

¹ Source: HMRC, Coronavirus Job Retention Scheme statistics: July 2021. Please note, the figures for June 2021 are based on claims received to the deadline of 14th July 2021. In some circumstances, late claims can be made with a reasonable excuse and in agreement with HMRC. Claims could also be amended until 28th July 2021. Therefore, the data for June 2021 is incomplete and should be considered provisional. It is estimated that the overall total number of employments on furlough in June 2021 will be in the region of 3% (around 0.1 million) higher once all claims are submitted and revisions applied.




The following chart shows the total number of employments furloughed in the UK over time to 30th June 2021:

- The latest provisional figures shows that the West Midlands region had 159,400 employments furloughed and the East Midlands region had 118,200 employments furloughed as of 30th June 2021 the lowest numbers on record (data available for 1st July 2020).
- Compared to the 31st May 2021, the West Midlands region decreased by 19.2% (-37,800 employments furloughed), while the East Midlands decreased by 22.2% (-33,800 employments furloughed), and the UK decreased by 24.1% over the same period.

The following chart shows for the East Midlands and West Midlands Regions the number of employments furloughed per day between 1st July 2020 to 30th June 2021:








 Of the 159,400 employments furloughed in the West Midlands region on the 30th June 2021, 81,400 were fully furloughed and 78,000 were partially furloughed. For the East Midlands, of the 118,200 employments furloughed 60,200 were fully furloughed and 58,000 were partially furloughed.

Employments Furloughed Over Time by Age - UK

- For all age bands the number of employments on furlough and the take-up rates decreased between 31st May and 30th June. The largest proportionate reduction of number of employments on furlough was for the under 18 age band.
- Since 1st July 2020, the under 18 and 18-24 age bands have had the highest proportion of eligible
 employments on furlough, followed by the 65 and over age band. However, in June 2021 the takeup rates of these youngest age bands decreased dramatically and are now in line with the other
 age bands. This reduction is line with the easing of restrictions across the UK, particularly in
 hospitality.
- The take-up rate for the 65 and over age band reduced more slowly than for the youngest age groups between 31st May and 30th June. Thus, at the end of June this age band had the highest take-up of all age groups the first time this has happened since the start of the scheme. This age band had a take-up rate of 10% for both female and male employments at 30th June 2021, in comparison with the 6% and 7% respectively for the total female and male populations.

The following chart shows the proportion of employments furloughed for the UK by the age of the employee between July 2020 to June 2021:





Employments Furloughed by Age - West Midlands and East Midlands Regions

• The highest number of employments furloughed by age group for the West Midlands region and also the East Midlands region on the 30th June was those aged 50 to 54 at 18,700 and 14,000 employments furloughed respectively. When compared to 31st May 2021, for this age bracket the numbers of employments furloughed decreased by 2,900 for both regions.

The following chart shows for the West Midlands region and the East Midlands region the number of employments furloughed by age group on the 30th June 2021:



Furlough by Employer Size - UK

- For all employer sizes, the number of employments on furlough decreased across February, March, April, May and June 2021. The largest reduction is for employers with 250 or more employees where the number of employments on furlough decreased by 254,400 from 595,200 employments at 31st May 2021 to a provisional estimate of 340,700 at 30th June 2021.
- Employers with one employment had 149,500 employments on furlough at 31st May 2021.
 Provisional figures show that this decreased in June to 138,900 employments on furlough at 30th June 2021.
- Medium and large sized businesses have the lowest proportion of eligible employments on furlough. Provisional figures for 30th June 2021 show that employers with 250 or more employees had 2% of eligible employees on furlough. Employers with 2 to 4 employees had the highest proportion of eligible employments on furlough at 22%.
- Between January and the end of June, the number of employments on furlough decreased by a larger proportion amongst large employers. Employers with 250 or more employees have seen a 79% reduction in employments on furlough since the peak in January, in comparison with a 33% reduction amongst employers with one employee. This may reflect the varying impact of the pandemic on businesses of differing sizes.





Employments Furloughed by Gender – Midlands Engine

- In total, the latest provisional figures show that Midlands Engine area had 264,900 employments furloughed on the 30th June 2021. This was 6.2% of eligible employments for the scheme compared to UK-wide of 6.5%.
- When compared to 31st May 2021, the Midlands Engine area had 66,900 fewer employments furloughed (-20.2%, UK: -24.1%).
- As of the 30th June 2021 for the Midlands Engine, the take up rate for males was 6.6% (UK 6.8%) and female take-up rate was 5.8% (UK 6.1%).
- Overall, the local authorities with the highest percentage of workers furloughed were Birmingham (8.3%), Solihull (8.1%) and Redditch (7.8%).
- The local authorities with the highest percentage of females furloughed were Rutland and Solihull (both 7.8%), Stratford-on-Avon (7.5%) and Oadby and Wigston (7.3%).
- The local authorities with the highest percentage of male employments furloughed was Birmingham (9.8%), Redditch (9.1%) and Solihull (8.6%).

Broad Sectors – Midlands Engine

 Accommodation and food services sector had the highest number of employments furloughed in the Midlands Engine on the 30th June with 43,450 people. The other sector had the least employments furloughed at 4,270 people.
