#### Welcome to Issue 13 of Midlands Matters, our Partnership newsletter.

As we move through Government's roadmap out of lockdown, all around us we can see an economy moving to embrace the long-awaited recovery.

In yesterday's Queen's Speech, we quite rightly saw a major focus on levelling up the regions - and we know that achieving a fairer economy brings a valuable prize. Data from our Midlands Engine Observatory shows a regional GVA gap – and just by closing that gap, the Midlands economy could generate an extra £76 billion each year for our country.

As discussed at the latest Midlands Engine Quarterly Economic Briefing, our region is now growing and showing fresh vigour: Goldman Sachs

is moving to Birmingham; the world's oldest modern factory in Derby has been transformed into the Museum of Making, ready to welcome its first visitors this month; and the reimagined Nottingham Castle will follow suit in June.

This event follows on from our Midlands UK Forum for Growth, held last November, which showcased over £17.6 billion worth of exceptional investment opportunities across our region.

Throughout the pandemic, our universities have produced world-class research in areas that will help us unlock the potential of our economy as we return to growth - whilst Midlands Engine Health continues to showcase our region's strengths in Health and Life sciences. Our latest report on specialist rehabilitation services, an area in which the Midlands is leading, highlights one of many areas where our region makes a vital contribution to the health of the nation.






