The West Midlands Health Technologies Cluster (WMHTC) is a new initiative being developed to make existing companies more successful, as well as attracting investment and new businesses to the region. WHMTC Executive Chair David Kidney: "We set up a health technologies cluster in 2020 to help businesses in this sector to help themselves be more successful.
