Diabetes in the Midlands. The Facts.





One in every 13 adults in the Midlands has diabetes. This is the highest prevalence of any regionⁱ



Obesity counts for as much as 85% of the overall risk of developing type 2 diabetesⁱⁱ



Prevalence of type 2 diabetes is higher in areas of greater deprivationⁱⁱⁱ



Every week diabetes contributes to more than 2,100 cases of heart failure in England, including 420 cases in the Midlands^{iv,v}



Every week diabetes contributes to more than 130 amputations in England, including 25 in the Midlands^{vi,vii}



80% of NHS spend on diabetes goes on treating complications associated with diabetes^{viii}



Improving diabetes control could lead to around £1.795bn productivity savings across the UK^{ix}



Over the next 10 years, the Midlands Engine Observatory estimates that improving type 2 diabetes control could result in potential productivity savings of £269.25m in the Midlands^x



It is estimated that there are up to 100,000 emergency callouts annually for hypoglycaemia (when blood sugar (glucose) level is lower than normal) in the UK, costing £13.6m per year to the NHS^{xi}





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
